15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Margherita College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and follows the curriculum offered by the University. The CBCS curriculum has been introduced since 2019. The college at present offers courses in Humanities, Social Sciences, Education, Commerce and some Science subjects. The college looks forward to the implementation of NEP from the forthcoming session where a large pool of multidisciplinary, choice-based courses will be offered. - Multiple entry and exits will come into force thereafter. Hence the offer of Mutidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary courses in our college are restricted to Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As of now, the college has not registered itself at NAD and ABC. The provision will be available by the parent university for the Undergraduate level students from the forthcoming academic session. The college welcomes the concept and looks forward to adopt it.

17.Skill development:

Under the CBCS Curriculum of Dibrugarh University., the college offers Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) such as Tourism Management, Basic in Elementary teaching learning, and Entrepreneurship.

Moreover, NSS is introduced as a skill enhancement course which benefits the student community at large in acquainting them with skills of social service and community engagement.

The college conducts regular workshops, seminars, lectures, presentations, and training programmes which aim at the skill development of its stakeholders. The college has organized various programmes like grammar workshops, Soft Skill Training programme, workshops on communication skills, etc. aiming at the skill development of its learners. The faculty members of the college are regularly encouraged to impart their lessons in ways which help the students augment their competencies. Add-on-courses on Event Planning and Management, Diploma in Computer Applications, NGO Management, Spoken English, Civil Service Foundation Course, Rural Development & Skill Development, Functional Hindi and Functional Bengali have also being introduced.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Under the CBCS curriculum offered by the Dibrugarh University, MIL (Modern Indian Language) viz; Assamese, Hindi and Bengali have been incorporated as a compulsory course for the BA students. Moreover, Honours program in Assamese is available and from next academic session, the department of Hindi will also be offering Major in The classrooms of the college are multilingual in nature. With English and Assamese as the primary mediums of instruction, Hindi is also used as and when required. The central library of the college has a good stock of literature on indigenous art, craft, theatre, languages, literatures, and culture. The department of Anthropology supervises project works on the socio-cultural beliefs and value practices of different tribes and ethnic communities residing in and around Margherita. There is a Tribal Study Centre in the college showcasing the rich culture heritage of the tribal communities. The college plans to design and offer add on courses, revolving around Indian knowledge systems, in the near future. Yoga is promoted through regular activities. The college celebrates International Mother Language Day and organizes program to commemorate the birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore in Bengali, Silpi Divas in Assamese etc. Such programs aim to promote the rich cultural heritage of India and inculcate a sense of pride and appreciation among the students.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institution places great emphasis on providing students with a comprehensive understanding of the curriculum, as well as the expected outcomes and achievements. The CBCS Curriculum of UG course under Dibrugarh University has laid down the course outcomes. The faculty members of the college orient their students with the expected course-specific outcomes through orientation programs, classroom discussions, expert lectures, etc. In addition to regular classroom teaching, the institution also offers tutorial classes and a mentor-mentee system that prioritizes outcome-based education. Add on courses like Spoken English and Foundation Course for Civil Services are designed keeping in mind the rationales of outcome based education. Besides these, the college also believes in the power of intangible outcomes like life-skills, values, empathy, compassion, etc and tries that their students achieve these.

20.Distance education/online education:

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Margherita College is equipped with two open and distance learning centers - Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University and Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University. KKHSOU offers UG programmes in Arts and Commerce, and PG programmes in Assamese, Education, English, Sociology, and Political Science. It also offers a diploma course in Human Resource Management. DODL, DU study center offers PG programmes in Assamese, Economics, Education, English, Political Science, Sociology, and Commerce. The faculty members of the college teach the students enrolled under these centers on Sundays. Study materials are designed and distributed regularly. online classes are conducted whenever necessary to help students stay on track with their coursework. These online classes enable students to interact with teachers and classmates in real time, making it easier for them to clear their doubts.

The diverse programs offered under Arts, Commerce and Science are:

On Gender: From the most fundamental concept of Gender to feminist philosophy and feminist thoughts and application of feminist research methodology; gender and its intersectionality with the social phenomenon. Political Science, Sociology, English and Education has papers on women empowerment, gender equality etc... It further questions the patriarchal domain, the historical and political situation of women in the present scenario. Various seminars, talk programs are organized in the college on gender issues.

A compulsory paper on Environmental Studies is taught at undergraduate level. It includes basic concept of environment, ecology and ecosystem, biodiversity and its conservation, natural resources, pollution, social issues and the environment, disaster management etc. It sensitizes environmental knowledge, awareness, attitude, skills and provides opportunity to involve actively in environmental issues by doing field study on environment related topics/ problems and prepare field report

All the faculties consistently focus on Human Values while teaching different topics in their respective curricula. The NSS unit of the college is engaged in different social activities like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, cleanliness programs and different awareness programs, etc., which helps in spreading human values in the society.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Institution has adopted some common policies to assess the learning levels of advance, average as well as slow learners. In the beginning of every new session an orientation programme is conducted by the institution for the students. This programme helps the students to get familiarize with the institution and the overall teaching learning process, methodology adopted in teaching learning, available facilities in the institution campus and activities run by each departments throughout the academic session.

The institution assesses the learning levels of the students through various assessment tools like - Sessional Exams, Seminar presentation, viva-voce exam etc. on a regular basis. The institution centrally conducts various tests & Sessional Exams. The institution conducts counselling sessions regularly for the advanced learners engaging experts from the various fields. Remedial classes are provisioned by the departments for the slow learners and have been conducted in the session 2022-23.

The departments of the institution also conducted tutorial classes and also provide lecture notes/ course materials to the slow learners. The Advanced, Average and slow Learners are also provided with the exposure of capacity development and skill enhancement trainings.

The basis of selection of the Advance and Slow learners is based upon their performance in the previous/ appeared examinations.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Learning is made more students centric through the combination of old and new methods of teaching. The institution practices various student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enriching learning experiences for the students.

The institution organizes cultural exchange programmes among the students representing to diverse ethnic culture of the region and neighbouring state Arunachal Pradesh.

To make the classes interactive and interesting most of the teachers emphasize on the use of Audio-Visual aids, Field Visits on a regular intervals etc.

To enhance the thinking capacity beyond the scope of theoretical knowledge various participative activities viz., group discussions, projects, field visits, educational tours, departmental seminars, lectures are conducted. The students actively participate in these activities within and outside the college. The internal examinations are thoroughly planned to appraise the student's performances. Written assignments are also required to be submitted by students as per University regulations.

The students are encouraged to present their seminar assignments in order to help them overcome stage fear and develop oratory skills.

Almost all departments of the institution have incorporated specific methods like field projects, presentations, and invited talks on regular intervals.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The College has an effective Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) System. As per the Dibrugarh University guidelines, the College conducts its Internal Assessments. The processes are as follows: a) Seminar/ Group Discussion etc are conducted & home assignments/ projects are assigned to every student which needs to be submitted as per the pre-stated directives. 5% weightage is given to a student's attendance. Generally both written and oral methods are used to assess the progress/ intelligence of the students. Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) System carries marks (20% weightage). In every semester two sessional examinations are conducted as per University norms. c) Retests are conducted on exceptional grounds. d) The marks of both the internal examinations are put up in the Notice Boards of the respective departmental Notice Boards. Class tests / individual & group presentations are also conducted to assess & improve the performances of the learners. Answer scripts are shown to the students after evaluations.

Since the introduction of FYUGP the in-semester assessments for the papers have also been conducted as per strict guidelines issued by the Dibrugarh University in this regard.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The Grievances handling mechanism with regard to internal examination is completely transparent at Margherita College. The Exam schedules for Internal Exam are centrally prepared and circulated by authority well in advance. Exam schedules are prepared

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as per the Academic Calendar issued by the University authority and communicated to student community in advance. All faculty members of the institution used to discuss the components of the internal assessment and evaluation process with the students in the beginning of every semester and it goes on like that till the completion of the programme. Internal examination routines are carefully prepared

After the internal examination the evaluated scripts are also shown to the concerned students. The students can also report to the concerned authority regarding the course progress if it is not satisfactory before the commencement of exams.

The grievances related to the internal examinations are mostly resolved at the concerned departmental level and on a few occasions by the conduction board. The errors in marks, attendance, subjects etc. are immediately addressed, corrected and quickly disposed by the concerned department/ Examination Conduction Board of the institution.

Each and every member of the concerned exam boards takes appropriate steps for the quick disposal of student grievances at their respective quarters. Close and continuous communication is maintained by the board members for speedy disposal of queries. In the case of internal practical tests, if any students point-out any discrepancy, the concerned teachers take immediate action to address and resolve the same.
